
The importance of water in the countryside.

A. Think:

- Have you ever wondered where rain water goes?

B. Look at this picture of the water cycle.

Discuss with your friends: Water is very important for all living creatures. We need water to drink, cook, bathe and to clean our houses. We also use it to water our plants.



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C. The phases of the water cycle are all jumbled.

Arrange them in the correct order according to the picture. Number 2 must be written twice!

Water vapour rises, cools and condenses into water droplets forming clouds.

Rain falls on the hills, valleys and fields.

Rain also falls into the sea.

The sun heats up the water from the sea, from puddles, from trees and from the fields. This water turns into water vapour.

The wind moves the clouds. When these drops of water grow, it rains.
