Let's learn about maps and plans.
Let's learn how to make the plan of a class, a school and a square.
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## A. Read about Plans.

Plans are designed by architects. Architects design houses, schools, palaces, gardens, roads, tunnels or other buildings.

The design of the plan shows us the size and the internal and external appearance of the building.


The plan therefore shows us the layout of the building designed by the architect. It shows us the location of the rooms, yards, doors, windows and other details.

Other professionals, like engineers also need to draw plans during their work. These might be plans of machines and other useful items.


If you were to climb up a ladder and look down, the table would look like this. You wouldn't be able to see the legs.

This picture is called a PLAN.

## B. The Plan of a Class

The following is the plan of a class. This plan gives us a lot of information. It shows us the size of the class, the location of the desks and chairs, the computers, the whiteboard and other objects necessary for learning.

It is important for the class to be large, airy and well-lit.
The symbols on the left represent the items which can be found in the classroom.

## C. The Plan of a School

By looking at this plan we can see the layout of the ground floor of this school. It is easy to locate the Headmaster's and assistant heads' office, the classrooms, the yard, the toilets, the corridors and other places.


The picture on the left shows us some more symbols.

## D. The Plan of a Village



In the centre of most towns and villages we find a big church.
The main roads surround the church. In these roads we find important buildings such as:

The Police Station
The Civic Centre
Shops
Services: dentist, notary, doctor...
Houses
Public Gardens
Playground
School.

The roads all have a name. These help people find the places they want to go to which makes life easier for everyone. The picture below shows an aerial view of Rabat centre, Malta.


The picture below shows the plan of the same Rabat centre. As one can see this is much easier to follow.
