Why does this occur?

This is due to the so called elements, which are:

This photo was taken in a really old place where once our ancestors used to worship the Gods they believed in at the time. These are the Megalithic Temples of Hal Tarxien.

What can we do to prevent further damage?

What can we do to PROTECT them; i.e. to CONSERVE them.

The second picture shows an example of how we are protecting other megalithic temples such as Haġar Qim and Imnajdra. They have been covered by a big tent.
