WHY THE TURKS ATTACKED MALTA

Read and answer.

The Order of St. John was always the biggest enemy of the Turks. The fleet of the Order had always attacked the galleys of the Turks in the Mediterranean. Moreover, the knights often helped other Christian strongholds against the Turks. For this reason, the Sultan Suleiman decided to destroy once and for all this Order which gave him so much grief.

Malta was also in a very good strategic position in the middle of the Mediterranean Sea. From here, the knights could easily control the trade routes between the East and the West.
